As the pilot population (gracefully) grays, it's obvious that getting young people excited about flying is vital to aviation's future.

What about adults who've considered learning to fly, but never did? Maybe they've dreamt of becoming a pilot, but for one reason or another, never took the first step. I run into people like this on a regular basis. EAA has a new program to get these people in the air. It's called "Flying Start". Unlike Rusty Pilots, this program is designed for people who've always wanted to fly, but never got around to it. Many times, it's just because the opportunity never came to their doorstep. This would require a few of us to donate our time for putting on a prepared program on what's involved to become a pilot. Ideally, it would then involve an Eagle Flight, which is like Young Eagles for grownups. The difference is that we could schedule the flights for when it works out for us and the participants. To do this part, it would take a few of us to volunteer to take people flying. I'd really like to see our chapter to give this a try.
